# TIME@Net pilot course

The training course is dedicated to professionals dealing with work inclusion pathways of young people with intellectual disability. The training course is aimed at increasing strategic competences for successful implementation of work inclusion pathways through the involvement of the companies and other relevant stakeholders in the process.

## **The main objectives of pilot training are:**

- To enrich the knowledge of relevant professionals on issues related to work inclusion pathways of young people with intellectual disability (innovative training approaches and methodologies, career counselling, types of integration on the labour market, relevant actors, good practices exchange, companies involving and commitment, attitudes change) and to acquire skills for strategic planning and networking.
- To supply tools and support the acquisition of competencies to work efficiently with young people with intellectual disability and help them to develop specific and key competencies in order to foster their Active Citizenship, improve their participation in the job market and expand their social inclusion opportunities.
- To empower professionals for independent work in the field of work inclusion paths for young people with intellectual disabilities and to ensure that participants of the pilot training will do inclusion paths also after training (implemented successful interventions by involvement of companies and other relevant organizations also after the training).

## **Duration of the training:**

30 hour (5 days)

## **Place of the training:**

Development and Education Centre Novo Mesto (Topliška cesta 2, 8000 Novo mesto, Slovenia)

## **Number of participants:**

10 professionals from companies, employment services, agencies, and health, social and employment services (2 from each country of the Time@net partnership - Italy, Portugal, Bulgaria, Spain and Slovenia) involved in work inclusion pathways of young people with intellectual disability.

## **Working language:**

The course will be conducted in English.

## **Organizational references:**

The course will be conducted by expert trainers from different sectors: psychologists, marketing and social marketing experts, experts in facilitating the work integration, learning assessment and labour market.

## **Methodology:**

Emphasis will be given on the use of active and effective teachings methods, methods which enhance creativity, exchange of practical experiences, constructive and strategic solving problems. The main tool for implementation of the pilot course will be the TIME@net handbook.

## **Certificate of attendance:**

At the end of the training the participants will receive a certificate of attendance.

9.00–12.15 MODULE 5: The preparation work connected to the implementation context and to the specific course – instructions for implement work inclusion plan - Steps of the inclusion plans, Individual plan

## Obligations of participants

For successful completion of training the independent work (before and after the training) is foreseen, as follows:

### 1. Before training:

Each participant of the training will choose one example of good practice from work inclusion pathways for young persons with intellectual disabilities and example of an individual plan, you are using at your work.

### 2. Following training:

Each participant of the training will have to do together, in cooperation with relevant organizations and companies (professional team) individual plans of work inclusion pathways of 5 young persons with intellectual disabilities and realize the initial steps of the plan. These plans will have to be sent to partner organization till 30th June 2016.

Great attention will be given on implementation of gained knowledge, skills and new tools after the training – implementation into every day work - work inclusion pathways for young people with intellectual disabilities. Thus participants will receive evaluation questionnaires also 2 months after the pilot course.
